MAX (born Mordechai, later called Marx) KOPPEL (A)
at first master glazier, later stone mason in Kleinerdingen,
since 1876 stone mason and sculpturer in Noerdlingen
born 17 Jun 1840 Kleinerdingen, died 17 Apr 1917 Noerdlingen
(parents = master glazier Josef Koppel + wife Henriette nee Wittelshoefer)

married 28 May 1866 in Meitingen (north of Augsburg)

PEPPI (born Pessle, later called Babette) NEUBURGER
born 20 Oct 1836 Binswangen, died 8 Mar 1905 Noerdlingen
(parents = teacher Isaak Neuburger + wife Esther nee Ofner)

CHILDREN (all born in Kleinerdingen):

- (1) JETTE (born Henriette) 14 Apr 1867 - ? married before 1917
factory owner NN Franken in Neustadt/Saale
- (2) EMIL (born Ephraim) 12 Nov 1872 - 23 Nov 1941 (died in Noerdlingen)
married 29 Nov 1899 in Oettingen
Sofie Gutmann of Oettingen (1874 - 1914)

- (3) DAVID 12 Oct 1873 - 03 May 1934 (died in Noerdlingen)
married 25 Oct 1873 in Kleinerdingen
Jenny Wassermann of Munich (1879 - 1935)

- (4) JOSEPH (B) 24 Sep 1875 - 26 Jun 1879 (died in Noerdlingen)

(A) Max Koppel settled in Noerdlingen (B 76 Kammgasse) as a stone mason and sculpturer before 1886. Around 1897 he founded a marble cutting business in Noerdlingen, which he managed together with his sons David and Emil. The buildings of this company at Loepsinger Landstrasse were sold to the city of Noerdlingen in 1935. It was since then (and still in 2004) used as a shoe factory (brand name Stabilo) by the Hartmann family.

Noerdlingen City Archives GIV-11 = In 1897 Max Koppel was permitted to erect buildings for a stone mason and stone grinding business next to the train station of Noerdlingen. Before he had lived at B 76 Kammgasse (near Berger Tor).

(B) named after his grandfather Joseph Koppel who had died 24 Feb 1874
