## ABRAHAM WEILER

hazzan and teacher in Noerdlingen since 1870 (A)  
born 13 Jun 1852 Fischach, died 9 Jan 1908 Augsburg (Diakonissen Hospital)  
(parents = Emanuel Weiler + wife Sofie nee Kahn)

married 17 Aug 1874 in Noerdlingen

## REGINA (born Rachel) BIER

born 5 Sep 1851 Hainsfarth, died 17 Nov 1914 Munich  
(parents = master baker Max Bier + wife Sara nee Lehmann)

## CHILDREN (all born in Noerdlingen):

- (01) JERTA 17 Jun 1874 - ?  
married Ludwig Margulies in Vienna (Austria),  
Ludwig and Jerda became directing managers of the  
Springer Orphanage in Vienna  
  
(originally she had been planned to marry Dr Emil  
Podiebrad, a college professor in Prague, but he  
had died unexpectedly around 25 May 1895 = date of  
his obit in the Noerdlingen newspaper)
- (02) EMANUEL 20 Jun 1875 - ?  
(born Menachem) married Grete NN  
Emanuel hat his own business in Johannesburg  
(South Africa)
- (03) ANNA xx Jul 1876 - 16 May 1877 (buried in Wallerstein)
- (04) GETTA (or Geda) 05 Oct 1877 - ?  
emigrated to the USA before 1912  
married before 1905 Alfred Peck  
(couple had a daughter Elsie, born ca 1905)  
Alfred Peck had a printshop in Jamaica, Queens NY
- (05) BERTHA 16 Feb 1880 - 04 Dec 1941 (suicide in Munich)  
married 11 Sep 1911 in Munich  
Moritz Maier  
(born 23 Apr 1872 Muehlheim in Baden)  
son of David Hirsch Maier + Betty nee Wurzweiler (?)  
"disappeared" during holocaust in Minsk ?  
Bertha hade spent ten years as a milliner in New York  
around 1900/10 together with her sister Selma and  
then returned to Bavaria
- (06) DINA 11 Feb 1881 - 27 Apr 1881 (died in Noerdlingen)
- (07) SELMA 22 May 1882 - 15 Feb 1918 (died of typhoid fever  
in Pretoria, South Africa) she had been in New York  
for 10 years around 1900/1910 with her sister

Bertha and then returned to Bavaria - later she went to South Africa to help her brother Emanuel - rumours are that she probably shot herself to death

- (08) KARL ISAI                      08 Aug 1883 - 01 Sep 1883 (died in Noerdlingen)
- (09) DAVID                            (B) 27 Nov 1884 - ?  
   married 23 Dec 1913 in Munich  
   Jakobine Wassermann (born 19 Jun 1891 Nuernberg)  
   (C) parents = hop dealer David Wassermann in Munich  
   + second wife Bella nee Kronheimer  
   David Weiler studied law at the Wuerzburg University  
   and later became a lawyer in Munich, in 1936 he  
   went to Palestine together with his wife Jakobine  
   and his daughter Agnes
- (10) BENJAMIN                        26 Feb 1886 - ?  
      (called Bennie)                married Ida Gerstele (later divorced)  
   he was supposed to become a teacher but decided  
   to become a cook (later in USA ?)
- (11) LUDWIG                           03 Apr 1887 - ?  
   married Johanna Stuehler  
   emigrated to South Africa in 1904, joined his brother  
   Emanuel's business and fought in the Boer War against  
   the British troops, later in World War I he sabotaged  
   against the British Army and therefore was put into  
   jail for two years and had to leave South Africa. In  
   1929 he returned to Oranje Free State, and in 1931 he  
   bought a liquor store in Johannesburg where he  
   finally settled
- (12) THERESE BELLA                   30 Oct 1888 - ?  
      (called Tessie)                emigrated to the USA, married Louis Piotti  
   (a baritone singer from Bologna, Italy ?)
- (13) MAX                                28 Mar 1895 - 06 Jun 1895 (died in Noerdlingen)
- (14) JOSEF                             07 Oct 1896 - ?  
      (called Joe)                    emigrated to the USA before 1912  
   married Barbara NN

(A) Abraham Weiler became the first hazzan of the Jewish Community of Noerdlingen, when it was founded in 1870. He stayed in this position until his death. For some time he also was in the position of a master shooter of the local rifle organisation.

(B) David Weiler became a lawyer in Munich (Dr jur + rer pol) and emigrated in 1936 to Palestine together with his wife + daughter Agnes Mathilde (born 31 Mar 1919 in Munich). Agnes married Herbert Wolf and emigrated from Israel to the USA.

(C) David Wassermann was born 23 Dec 1842 as son of Heymann Wassermann (1812-1845) and his wife Regine. David Wassermann's first wife was Amalie nee Hecht (1853 - 1884), his second wife Bella nee Kronheimer was born in 1855.
